

**Laboratory Technician (Fall Semester 2021 – Part Time)** – Lee County Hyacinth Control District is currently accepting applications for a Laboratory Technician to assist the Water Quality Laboratory Manager with the maintenance of the laboratory, conducting research on aquatic weed control methods, conducting water quality tests and assists with the sampling and monitoring of aquatic vegetation.

Responsibilities will include:

- Washes laboratory glassware and cleans other equipment
- Assists with the set-up of laboratory water quality tests
- Assists with conducting water quality tests
- Collect water samples from various bodies of water in the field
- Performs a variety of maintenance duties as needed to keep laboratory clean and functioning properly
- Conducts data entry of testing and research data into database
- Periodically conducts quality control checks to ensure the laboratory is following the quality control protocols
- Assist in preparing presentation and workshop materials and assist with coordinating events
- Other duties and projects as assigned

Qualifications:

- Undergraduate student at an accredited college or university who is working towards a degree in a science field in which laboratory experience would be beneficial
- Ability to work a regular schedule of 16-20 hours per week and be able to work for the duration of the Fall Semester
- Ability to learn how to operate a variety of boats and other small equipment
- Must have basic computer skills
- Must be able to read and understand chemical label instructions and be able to communicate effectively in English
- Must have a valid Class E Florida driver's license and a clean driving record

Pay rate is \$13.40 per hour. This position is not eligible for benefits. Position will work a regular schedule of 16-20 hours per week during the Fall Semester; however, the exact days/hours can be flexible to accommodate class schedules.
